Corpor	rately, we are to Jesus when we agree together in prayer.
III.	We Pray Rom. 15:30-32
•	Intercessory prayer is very Christlike.

Luke 23:34 Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. And they parted his raiment, and cast lots.

Heb. 7:25 Wherefore he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them.

IV.	We Pray 1 Thes. 5:17
•	A key to praying frequently is not quenching the Spirit.
1 Thes. 5:19 Quench not the Spirit.

Psa. 55:17 Evening, and morning, and at noon, will I pray, and cry aloud: and he shall hear my voice.	
V.	We Pray 1 Tim. 2:8
•	When we pray, we must be clean (lifting up holy hands), right with others (without wrath), and full of faith (doubting).
Doubt not only displease the Lord (Psa. 78), but it essentially renders praying as a exercise.	
Jas 1:5 If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all <i>men</i> liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. 6 But let him ask in faith, nothing wavering. For he that wavereth is like a wave of the sea driven with the wind and tossed. 7 For let not that man think that he shall receive any thing of the Lord. 8 A double minded man <i>is</i> unstable in all his ways.
