- 4. This is so prevalent a problem that Solomon repeats this same thought over and over throughout Ecclesiastes. almost identically repeated 4 times.
- 5. Solomon does correctly acknowledge that the good things such as food, drink are from the LORD.
- 6. And the man who has dedicated himself to God does, with thanks, acknowledge and enjoy Gods provisions on earth.
- 7. But the servant of God however is instructed in Eph 5:16 to redeem the time, because the days are evil....so his life goals are always on the eternal and not just the provisions here.
